Multi-Event Calendar AVA Web page: This page, found under the Events tab on the AVA website, has information about festivals, such as the Columbia Gorge Walks, Regional conferences and other events with multiple events and more than one day. Please check this page. There are events on it from our region that are no longer being held. Note what information is normally shown on other events. Events could be one year only or multiple/biennial years.

- 4. Good News Whidbey Walking Festival: The Northwest Tulip Trekkers are busy planning the Whidbey Walking Festival for September 11-13, 2015. This festival was last held in 2012. We'll hear more about the walks that will be held and other festival information. Put this destination weekend on your calendar. I love to see this one back. People come from all over: down from Canada, and from many other states outside the NW.
